Terms of Reference for the Review Panel

1. The task of the Review Panel is to conduct an independent assessment of the effectiveness and impact of BBSRC's Follow-on Fund (FoF) over the past decade, including standard FoF, SuperFoF and Pathfinder awards.
2. Specifically, the objectives are to:
